OUR JUDGE TIM HUTCHINGS - WINUWUK BOXERS, UK



We are very privileged to have as our judge Tim Hutchings (tall chap in picture) of the world famous Winuwuk Boxers. They have owned and bred many notable UK Boxer champions, who have now won well over 200 CCs.

Their famous champion, Ch/Ir Ch Winuwuk Lust at First Sight (Max) is the most successful Boxer ever in UK Group competition, including two group wins at Crufts. He was the top working dog in 2010 and in 2009 when he was also runner-up all breeds. Now a veteran, he has just won his 70th CC, has 21 Group wins and 3 BIS all breeds to his credit. He is the 6th top winning dog of all time, all breeds, in the UK.

Tim has been judging the breed since 1988 and has been a Championship show judge since 1995. He has judged Boxers at Championship Shows on 40 occasions in 11 different countries. This includes judging the British Boxer Club twice, the American Boxer Club National Specialty, the Canadian National and the Australian National. He will be judging Boxers at Crufts in 2013.

At the British Boxer Club's "BOSCARS" awards ceremony he was honoured with the very first 'Best Judge' award which was nominated and balloted for among the entire club membership.

This is a not-to-be-missed opportunity to have a judge of Tim's standing and expertise go over your Boxer and we are hoping to present him with a record entry on the 17th October.

Have you ever wondered why so many of our trophies have Cape of Good Hope Boxer Club inscribed on them? It certainly got me scratching in the archives to see whether I could unravel a little bit of the early history of our club.

WPBC: THOSE EARLY DAYS

Article by Barbara Cook published in SCRAPS June 1998

A fascinating scratch through old dusty files revealed that the beginnings of our club can be traced back to an informal meeting held by a group of boxer enthusiasts on 24 July 1952 in the Youngsfield

government village lounge. At this first 'get-together', an interim committee was elected to draw up a draft constitution and to make arrangements for an Inaugural General Meeting. The latter meeting was held on 19 August 1952 at the Hotel Cecil in Newlands, with 14 foundation members joining the Western Province Boxer Club (WPBC). Membership in that first year grew rapidly, and by August 1953, the club boasted 55 members.

The club held its first match meeting on 14 February 1953 at the Princis Hotel in Claremont, where none other than Allon Dawson himself judged! For those of you who might not be aware, Allon Dawson was the owner of the world famous Stainburndorf boxer kennels in the UK. Some valuable publicity by the Cape Times ensured a good turnout of over 35 boxers for the great event.

It was at this "show" that Mr Dawson donated a rather valuable solid silver trophy to the club—the Stainburndorf Floating Trophy for the Boxer of the Year.

At about the time of the formation of the Western Province Boxer Club, boxer folk up north were also getting together with a view to forming a club, and so it was that the Boxer Club of Southern Africa was formally launched at a meeting at the Grand National Hotel in Johannesburg on 28 July 1952, thus making this club the oldest boxer specialist club in South Africa. Both clubs became affiliated to KUSA shortly after their formation, and this is reported in the September 1952 issue of the then "South African Kennel Union Gazette".

But I still have not explained the origins of the name "Cape of Good Hope Boxer Club", and, for that matter, whatever became of the Boxer Club of Southern Africa. To answer this, I need to tell you about the formation of the Federation of Boxer Clubs of South Africa (FBCSA) - an event which was to have far reaching implications for the development of the breed in South Africa.

The FBCSA was formed because of a longstanding dispute between the South African Kennel Union (now KUSA) and some members of the boxer fraternity regarding the question of showing boxers with cropped ears. Some breeders had spent large sums of money on imported cropped-eared dogs from Germany and America, and were thus unhappy that they could not be shown.

Initially three KUSA boxer clubs—the Boxer Club of Southern Africa, the Central South African Boxer Club and the Northern Boxer Club of Southern Africa broke away from the S A Kennel Union.

These events up north were viewed with great concern by members of the WPBC. At a meeting in November 1960, attended by 16 members, a resolution to approach both the S A Kennel Union and the newly constituted FBCSA with a view to trying to heal the breach was unanimously accepted.

But still some of the members were restless. Another extraordinary general meeting was held on 24 April 1961—a meeting which was to prove very significant. The dogeared minutes which record the events of that night could not have captured the tension amongst the 26 members present. After a lengthy debate, a vote was taken to decide whether or not the WPBC should break away from the S A Kennel Union and join the FBCSA. The result — 11 votes in favour, 14 against, and 1 abstention. And so it was that the WPBC remained within the S A Kennel Union, albeit without the likes of Don Loon and the Ballantynes who had handed in their resignations straight after the voting. The formation of a new club followed swiftly with the inauguration of the Cape of Good Hope Boxer Club on 8 May 1961 at the Goodwood Hotel, under the chairmanship of Dr Loon. An initial membership of 43 seemed to auger well for the long term future of this new FBCSA affiliated group of boxer fans, which included the likes of Ellie and Gordon Wilson of Idle Winds boxers, and Angus and Peggy Ballantyne and Dr Loon of Sunnybrae boxers. Gordon Wilson closed the meeting with the following words ..."We are gathered here in the presence of all you good people to join together the cropped-ear boxer and the natural-eared boxer in a lasting union. If any of those present know of any good reason why they should not be joined together, he has had his chance to speak and must now forever hold his peace. What we have tonight joined together let no man put asunder."

Dramatic stuff, but this was not to be the case. At first enthusiasm ran high, and a mere four months after its formation, the Cape of Good Hope Boxer Club held its first championship show. Regular articles were a feature of early issues of the FBCSA's Boxer Bulletin, and membership grew steadily, topping the hundred mark by the club's first AGM. However, despite the early success of their championship shows, entries dwindled due to the isolation of this FBCSA club relative to the other clubs, and in 1971, the Cape of Good Hope Club officially deaffiliated itself from the FBCSA, and approached the WPBC regarding amalgamation of the two Cape Town Clubs.

It is interesting to note that 1963 saw the formation of the FBCSA affiliated Boland Boxer Club, spearheaded by the Gordons, a sign perhaps that all was not well within the early executive of the Cape of Good Hope Boxer Club. The Boland club was short lived—after approximately five years of relative inactivity, it ceased to exist.

It was important following that fateful night in April 1961 to stem the tide, thus the general letter of 3 July 1961 written by the Secretary of the WPBC, and addressed to the members. I quote:

"In view of the present rift in the boxer world of Southern Africa, it would seem of the utmost importance that those of us who have not broken away from the S A Kennel Union should keep in touch with each other... the [club] numbers 59 and shows no sign of breaking up.... New members continue to join."

And so it was that the club has grown from strength to strength, and now (1998) has over 200 members. (Editor's note: that was in 1998).

Down Memory Lane

SPOTLIGHT ON GARRYMORE BOXERS

Article by Barbara Cook published in SCRAPS March 1997



No account of the early days of boxers in South Africa would be complete without including Mrs Prim Crighton's highly successful Garrymore kennels.

Established in 1951, this kennel made up 27 champions between 1953 and 1986, 21 of which were homebred..

Prim remembers that the first boxer to be shown in 1947, had been imported by Kelvin Clegg from Allon Dawson's successful Stainburndorf kennels in the UK.

Kelvin Clegg went on to import two more Stainburndorf boxers in 1949, and so it was to this kennel that Prim looked when importing some of her dogs.

Five of the six boxers imported by Garrymore boxers from the UK became champions. The

most successful of these was the flashy fawn and white dog Ch Stainburndorf Soames of Garrymore, a winner of 31 Best of Breeds and 17 Best in Show awards.

Another flashy brindle and white imported dog, Stainburndorf Whiteladies Rochester of Garrymore was also a Best in Show winner. It is amusing to note that the import Ch Tundra of Moonsfield was disqualified by a German judge at his very first show in 1952 because he had white socks!

PRIMROSE CRIGHTON

Tribute by Ken Hull published in SCRAPS Christmas 2004

First impressions do tend to last a long time.

It wasn't too long after Dawn and I bought Mickleham Iolanthe, a beautiful red Boxer girl from Nan Boor that we were roped in to the WP Boxer Club committee. That first committee meeting at Prim's home "Largo" could have sent me running. Anyone who knows me knows that I tend to speak my mind and I do not sit on committees just to fill the space. But here was a formidable, determined lady and amazingly I got through the meeting having said very little indeed. Prim closed the meeting and went off to the kitchen to see to the tea and I was left wondering what I had let myself in for. Well, I was soon to find out that being involved with this club would be fun. Prim emerged from the kitchen quite nonchalantly wearing a beautifully decorated porcelain chamber pot on her head!

And so was formed my lasting impression of Prim Crighton, tough and determined but fair and fun.

Prim was a founder member of the Western Province Boxer Club and served as chairman for 37 years. She was also one of the original Boxer breeders in the Cape using the kennel name "Garrymore". Following this she became the club's President and lately our patron. As long as she was able, Prim continued

to support and attend the Club's shows and functions and it was wonderful to have her attend the Club's 50th anniversary to see that her efforts had borne fruit.

Her dedication to the breed and to the Club are peerless.

In the few weeks since Primrose Crighton passed away I have heard one phrase repeatedly - "It's the end of an era". In many respects this is true but while eras end, legacies remain. What we do with that inheritance is up to us.

Mrs Crighton, a life member of the British Boxer Club, was a dominant force in boxers in the Cape, and was chairperson of the local Western Province Boxer Club for 35 years.

She was also involved at committee level with the Kennel Association, having been elected first as secretary in 1954, and later as chairman in 1960.

By the time Prim had retired from the show ring in the mid-'80s, Garrymore boxers had won 78 Best of Breed and 27 Best in Show awards, a most notable achievement when one considers that long and tedious hours of traveling to distant major showing centres made it relatively difficult to make up champions in the past.

Nan Boor arrived in SA in 1971 and from then on served WPBC in various capacities: as Editor of SCRAPS, as Vice-Chairman until 1988, then Vice-President until 1994 and thereafter as President. Paging through past issues of SCRAPS one encounters numerous charming, expressive little sketches by Nan, often accompanied by words of wisdom "Simon Says..." inspired by Ch Mazarat's Simon of Mickleham.






It was in 1952, while Nan was still in the Land Army and managing a herd of jersey cows, that she got her very first Boxer.

She was about to lose the last of her Spaniels, which she had been breeding for 20 years, and she was searching for a new breed.

A veterinarian friend of her suggested boxers.

"What on earth is a boxer?', I asked him.... I had never seen one and I didn't know what a boxer was!" said Nan.

Her friend took her to see a well-bred but half -starved litter of puppies aged four months and Nan's life was changed forever.

"The mother was a huge, red wrinkled affair, and that's what I wanted. But all the puppies had been fed on was pork bones—they looked more like four-week-old pups...

"I took a tiny little bitch to save her life and registered her Berries Scatterbrain. I called her Sally."

Sally, by Ch Cuckmere Andrew, was a wonderful character. She always remained very Nan with one of her very first Boxers, small, never making minimum size, but had five litters to Mickleham Solo and very seldom

needed any help in whelping. All Mickleham boxers since then, up to Betsey Trotwood, the last of the Mickleham Boxers, can be traced back to Sally.

Sally's lovely character kept popping up in Jo-Jo, Tosca and Jazzy.

Nan got her first male boxer when her Sally was six months old.

"I was showing a jersey cow which, incidentally, was made Supreme Champion that day, when I looked in at a dog show being held at the same grounds.


"There I saw a red male named Mickleham Solo, owned by Bunty and Innes Hutchinson. I arranged a future mating to Sally and started the ball rolling with my new prefix Salolo (Sally and Solo)."

That was more than 40 years ago.

NAN BOOR

Sola Star (Tosca), seen at four months on p 15, was the first home-bred puppy which Nan kept. She went on to great things. She was placed third out of 39 other boxer puppies at her very first show—the world famous Crufts!

She also gets the credit for getting Nan interested in obedience work, having worked well in Test C in the UK.

But the first champion was Solo's daughter, Firebird, followed by Ch Salolo Jazzy's son, Willy-Um, whom Nan brought to South Africa as an "old man" in 1971.

Willy-Um's dam, Salolo Red Topaz, died at age two during whelping, and her eight puppies had to be hand-reared.

When the pups were three days old, dear Grandma Sally, then aged 10, took over the litter. She topped and tailed them, cuddled and loved them and even produced enough milk to take them through the night without help from Nan,.

When Nan was forced to give up farming because of a slipped disc, she joined forces with Solo's owners, the Hutchinsons, in Dorset. She gave up her Salolo prefix and was granted a share in the Mickleham prefix by the English Kennel Club.

In 1969 Innes Hutchinson died and Nan decided to join her brother Lawrie and his family in South Africa.

During a month-long holiday here to make a final decision on whether to immigrate, Nan met club patron Prim Crighton.

Prim took her to see various kennels and arranged for her to judge an afternoon show.

Nan returned to the UK to breed the boxers she felt were needed for South Africa, using a dog from the world-famous Wardrobes kennel, Ch Wardrobes Hunter's Moon, and her bitch Ackendene Royal St John,

A beautiful litter was produced. It included Mickleham Pegasus, Mickleham Dido and Mickleham Merry-Go-Round, all three of whom later became champions.

She departed for South Africa with these three pups and her English champions Willy-Um and Bossy Boots. Pegasus who was particularly popular as a stud dog, won several Best of Breeds and multiple Best in Shows, as well as being SA Champion. Meanwhile Willy-Um sired another SA Champ, Nederburg Musetta. A lot of South African boxers' lineage can still be traced back to the five boxers Nan brought to South Africa on the mail ship SAS Vaal with her in October 1971.

On arriving here Nan rented kennels at Red Sun Ridge in Ottery. There she stayed for four years before buying her own kennels in Gordon's Bay. She later sold them to the Animal Welfare Society, which is still located there.

Nan had bred ten champions in South Africa and imported four.

(Owing to ill health Nan had to give up the last of her kennels, St Francis in Ottery, in 1996, at the age of eighty. She then went to live in Gordon's Bay with her brother, Lawrie and his wife Mary.—Editor)


SHOWDOGS: Do you have any amusing judging

anecdotes to share with us?



Doreen: Well, not to me personally but years ago on the Natal July Friday Group Day at the Kloof Golf Course where Hounds/Terriers/etc were judged, Albert Langley, from the UK, was judging the Terrier Group and withheld on the Scottish Terriers. The exhibitor, an elderly lady standing in first place in the Open Bitch Class dropped dead. What a to-do! Her body was moved to a trestle table while someone ran to the Clubhouse (no cell phones) to call up the family and ambulance. This happened about 11.00 am. His first project was to take SCRAPS from a typewriter and roneo produced newsletter, to a computerized and photocopied production. He got Husky to sponsor the cost of printing, with the covers, in exchange for a back cover advert.

Mickleham Iolanthe is behind all the Dawkendales. Her granddaughter Speanvlei Bon Chretien of Dawkendale (Ch Jenroy Lot Less Hassle of Dawnkendale X Dawnkendale Nota Bene of Speanvlei) was the first Dawkendale Champion. Johan Kieser was a great help in the early Cape Town years. He arranged the mating with Ch Aracrest's Ipso Facto which produced Nota Bene, and also assisted in the import of Jenroy Lot Less Hassle (Geordie) from Jenny Townshend in England. Ken has always known what he wanted in a Boxer and has line-bred and crossed to get it,

never being afraid to try what "felt" right, having studied the pedigrees involved.

Ken started judging dogs at the Kennel Association's December show in 1991. Today he is qualified to Judge the Working and Herding Groups, is a Boxer Specialist Judge and a qualified Breed Assessor. He has judged the National Boxer Show in Sweden and has judged in Australia and Ireland.

Ken has always been a "committed" person, he never joins an organization and just coasts along. In church youth groups, the George Lake Yacht Club, Round Table, KUSA and the WP Boxer Club, he is usually on the executive and always actively promoting the cause. Over the years he had held the position of Treasurer, SCRAPS editor and Chairman of the Boxer Club. He was Commodore at the Yacht Club, served in many positions in Round Table, including in his last year in Table being the Area Convener of beer sales at Newlands for the early day/night games.

Ken was re-elected Chairman of the Western Province Boxer Club in 2011.


